Particular features:

- Horizontal drying of wet or coated screens
- Optimal drying of coated screens - regardless of the emulsion thickness
- Rugged tubular construction of stainless steel V2A and varnished aluminum sheet
- Compact construction method
- 5 free-moving drawers, running on ball-bearings
- One drawer is capable of holding several screens
- Continuously adjustable heating temperature by means of digital temperature regulator
- Digital temperature display (reference/actual values)
- The covering can be used either as a work surface or optionally as a luminous LED surface

Temperature

- Continuously adjustable up to max. 45°C (at a room temperature of 20°C)

Version A1

- One-sided drawers to be pulled out towards the front

Version A2

- Two-sided drawers, to be pulled out towards the front and the back

Option I

- Energy-saving construction thanks to additional insulation

Option L

- Luminous surface with LED panel

Option S1

- Standard screen support

Option S2

- Screen support for small screens

Option V1

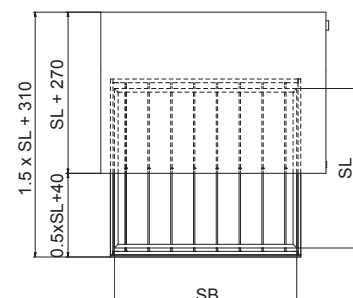
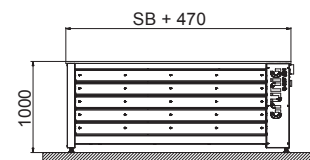
- Exhaust air hookup for connecting the dryer cabinet with a ventilation system installed by customers
